



*“Combating America’s Covert Hostility
Toward the Black Community”*

Introduction

In 2016, America finds itself on the precipice of self-destruction...and it's her own fault. For the vast majority of 12% of the population, over 37 million African-Americans, she has created a ¹schizophrenic, ²psychotic, ³self-hating group that has bought into her lies about color blind fairness and equality. For every stated "Step" America has made to promote the façade of equality, she has made multiple acts to ensure that façade never comes to fruition.

- In 1865, slavery and involuntary servitude were abolished, but quickly following were the ⁴"Black Codes", the ⁵Ku Klux Klan (America's 1st home grown Terrorist Organization) and ⁶"Convict Leasing", which was the precursor to today's Prison Industrial Complex.
- Despite the obvious exclusion of African-Americans in every facet of American life whereby equality and justice were denied, there was a rise of prominent Black people who sought to confront and deal with these issues, from WEB Dubois to Marcus Garvey, but America supported and propped up other persons of color who were either seen as non-threatening or continued promoting the façade of inclusion, i.e., Booker T. Washington, while systematically destroying the movements these former persons created, a practice which continues today.
- America "*allowed*" African-American men to fight on its behalf in every war it's had (although the US Armed Forces weren't completely desegregated until 1948, a seeming olive branch of an "equal footing" offer); however, regardless of the personal sacrifices and efforts made by these men to be "Good Americans" and prove their manhood and patriotism, they were continually treated as 2nd and 3rd class citizens when they returned home from these wars. From the Revolutionary War in 1775 to the war in Vietnam, and in many ways to today's War in Afghanistan & Iraq, African-Americans never came home to receive all the equality and rights of their White counterparts. In many cases, America treated its POWs better than they treated the African-American men who fought, bled and died on their side.
- In 1982, Ronald Reagan's "War on Drugs" resulted in a deliberate influx of crack cocaine into the Black community, massive incarceration of non-violent, small time drug users/sellers of crack cocaine and destruction of the black family and community...of which the effects are still plaguing the Black community to this day.

¹ **Schizophrenia** - A long-term mental disorder of a type involving a breakdown in the relation between thought, emotion, and behavior, leading to faulty perception, inappropriate actions and feelings, withdrawal from reality and personal relationships into fantasy and delusion, and a sense of mental fragmentation.

² **Psychosis** - A severe mental disorder in which thought and emotions are so impaired that contact is lost with external reality.

³ **Self-hate** - Intense dislike of oneself.

⁴ **Black Codes** - Laws that had the intent and the effect of restricting African Americans' freedom and of compelling them to work in a labor economy based on low wages or debt. Black Codes were part of a larger pattern of Southern whites trying to suppress the new freedom of emancipated African American slaves.

⁵ **Ku Klux Klan** - America's Oldest Hate Group.

⁶ **Convict Leasing** - A system of penal labor practiced in the Southern United States.

The above is a *very brief* snapshot into how America has treated Black people in this country. And to our credit, we have endured, but not without a few psychological afflictions attached along the way. We've endured because we are a sturdy, resilient people with big hearts, big ideas and strong wills. The fact that "Micah Johnson" hasn't happened more often, or doesn't happen on an annual, monthly or even weekly basis, is a testament to this fact. No group in the history of this nation has been systematically kept on the outside looking in, kept ignorant and without a knowledge of self, made illegal to progress and advance, culturally stripped of all that made them a people and, shortly after their inception in this country, made sub-human (see the Constitution's "3/5ths human" clause, congressional voting power aside) more than Black people.

Yet, African-Americans are still here; physically, mentally, spiritually and psychologically.

Imagine, if you will, a circle. In the middle of that circle is a Black community. It doesn't matter where the community exists geographically because all Black people in America have been affected by the same American system. Surrounding the principle circle of the Black community are other larger circles which depict the things that influence a healthy life and existence (protection, education, psychological health, opportunity, etc.) in a given community. For the Black community, the "Circles of Influence" that are needed to protect, sustain, mature and grow the community are non-existent, woefully inadequate or outright hostile. Comparably, in a White community, the many things needed to protect, sustain, mature and grow that community is supported by American culture and law. And to all those persons who say or have a mindset of, "Well. Just do it yourself and take care of your own community!" Interestingly enough, when we've tried AND succeeded in doing so, America has literally disrupted, attacked, raped, murdered, burned, dropped bombs (the 1st "9/11") on and destroyed those communities. When left to our own devices...left unmolested and unassaulted...the Black community not only does just fine, but we outperform white communities. These "Circles of Influence" will be presented, adequately discussed and used as proof to make the point that Black life in America really *has no value* to the dominant American culture; for if it did, again, these circles wouldn't exist and our country wouldn't be on the precipice of total chaos and destruction as it currently is.

Black America's continued existence in America is not due to America's greatness or her genuine love of Black people and/or presented ideals of equality, but more to her being *forced* to uphold those ideals. America is great *not because* she *chose to be*, but because she was *forced to be* by those she would rather exploit, disenfranchise, use, control and/or destroy. Despite America's continued efforts to promote the "façade of equality", the veil of this lie is being lifted for the masses to see. The "King" really is naked and the "Wizard" is only a man behind the curtain...and Black people are finally seeing and realizing this.

For White America, if this country is to be saved from itself, there must be an open, honest examination and critique of what's been done to 12% of its population. There must be a deep self-examination of not only what's been done, but how they've benefited ("White Privilege")


